SPECIAL DEPUTY RECEIVER’S
APPLICATION TO APPROVE SECOND EARLY ACCESS DISTRIBUTION

CANTILO & BENNETT, L.L.P., Special Deputy Receiver of Bright Healthcare Insurance Company of Texas (the “SDR” and “BHICOT,” respectively), files its Application to Approve Second Early Access Distribution (the “Application”).

I. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The SDR files this Application for authority to make a second early access distribution to the Texas Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association (“TLHIGA”) for \$1,676,584.64. TLHIGA is the only guaranty association having obligations arising from this liquidation. At present, the SDR estimates that the current unencumbered cash and cash equivalent assets of the BHICOT estate will exceed the amount of all Class 1 and Class 2 claims. Accordingly, providing an early access payment to TLHIGA in the requested amount is appropriate. Moreover, pursuant to relevant law, if the SDR’s estimates are incorrect, TLHIGA will repay the BHICOT estate any sums necessary to ensure that TLHIGA does not receive a preference for its claims.

II. AUTHORITY

2.1 The SDR is authorized to file this Application pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303, which provides for early access distributions to insurance guaranty associations with

the approval of this Court.

2.2 The subject matter of this Application is referred to the Special Master appointed in this proceeding in accordance with Section III of the *Order of Reference to Master* entered on November 29, 2023.

III. BACKGROUND

3.1 On November 29, 2023, the Court entered an *Agreed Order Appointing Liquidator, Permanent Injunction, and Notice of Automatic Stay* appointing the Texas Commissioner of Insurance as Liquidator of BHICOT. Effective November 29, 2023, the Texas Commissioner of Insurance, as Liquidator, appointed CANTILO & BENNETT, L.L.P. as SDR of BHICOT.

3.2 This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Application and of the affected parties pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE § 443.005.

3.3 On March 21, 2024, the SDR filed its *First Early Access Report Pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303(c)* and on November 22, 2024, the SDR filed its Application to Approve First Early Access Distribution (the “First Application”). There were no objections to the First Application and it was granted on January 22, 2025. The SDR made its first early access distribution on February 25, 2025.

3.4 The SDR has determined that the estate has distributable assets and now seeks Receivership Court authority to make a second early access distribution to TLHIGA, so the guaranty association may use the advance against distributions to pay its incurred Class 1 expenses and Class 2 payments of policyholder benefits.

IV. REPORT ON DISTRIBUTABLE ASSETS

4.1 **Approval of the Second Early Access Distribution.** Pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303, the SDR shall apply to the Court for approval to make early access payments to a

guaranty association having obligations in connection with the liquidation on at least an annual basis if distributable assets are available. However, distributions are not limited to a set timetable and the SDR may, at its sole and absolute discretion, seek a distribution at any time that it determines that an estate has distributable assets. Early access payments are not limited to the claims and expenses paid to date by a guaranty association; however, the SDR may not make a distribution to a guaranty association in excess of all anticipated claims of the guaranty association. Amounts advanced to a guaranty association under TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303 are treated as advances against distributions to be made under TEX. INS. CODE § 443.302.

TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303 (c) provides:

Within 120 days after the entry of an order of liquidation by the receivership court, and at least annually after the entry of the order, the liquidator shall apply to the receivership court for approval to make early access payments out of the general assets of the insurer to any guaranty associations having obligations arising in connection with the liquidation or shall report that there are no distributable assets at that time based on financial reporting as required in Section 443.016.

4.2 TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303(f) directs that an application for early access payments shall, based on the best information available to the SDR at the time, provide the following:

- (1) the amount reserved for the entire expenses of the liquidation through and after its closure and for distributions on claims, to the extent necessary and appropriate;
- (2) the computation of distributable assets and the amount and method of equitable allocation of early access payments to each of the guaranty associations; and
- (3) the most recent financial information filed with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners.

V. DISTRIBUTABLE ASSETS

5.1 TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303(a) defines “distributable assets” as all general assets of the receivership estate, less the necessary and appropriate amounts reserved for expenses of liquidation through and after closure and distributions on claims other than those of the guaranty associations that fall within the priority classes of claims established in § 443.301(b). As of

February 28, 2026, the unrestricted cash and cash equivalent assets of the receivership estate are approximately \$61,384,760. Copies of the February 28, 2026, Statement of Net Assets and Statement of Net Liabilities are attached as Exhibits 1 and 2, respectively. The amount reserved for the estimated remaining entire expenses of the liquidation through and after its closing is approximately \$22 million dollars. After adjustment for expenses of liquidation and establishing a prudent reserve, the SDR's estimate for liquid "distributable assets" for the second early access distribution is in excess of the \$1,676,584.64 that the SDR seeks to distribute to TLHIGA. The SDR's preliminary estimate for "distributable assets" is based upon current projections of the receivership's future activities. The receivership reserves may change substantially due to unforeseen factors beyond the SDR's control.

VI. GUARANTY ASSOCIATION CLAIMS

6.1 The SDR has determined that a second early access distribution in the amount of \$1,676,584.64 will satisfy substantially all of the association's incurred Class 1 and Class 2 covered claim payments.

6.2 All reporting by TLHIGA on its Class 1 and Class 2 liabilities in connection with the BHICOT estate (as well as the SDR's estimates of its Class 1 costs and the potential amount of other Class 2 claims not covered by TLHIGA) are subject to supplementation as additional expenses and claim payments are incurred. The claims and reserve numbers have not been verified or audited. They are used exclusively for making the calculations necessary for this Application. Neither this Application, nor any other early access application, constitutes an adjudication of the Proof of Claim filed by TLHIGA.

6.3 At this time, the SDR seeks to make a second early access distribution based on the incurred Class 1 expenses and Class 2 claim payments for TLHIGA. The SDR estimates that after

payment of the proposed second early access distribution, the BHICOT estate will retain sufficient unrestricted assets to pay all Class 1 and 2 claims in full.

VII. PROPOSED DISTRIBUTION

7.1 The SDR proposes to distribute \$1,676,584.64 from the receivership estate as the second early access distribution to TLHIGA. The SDR will make the distribution following thirty (30) days after the date the Order is entered by the Receivership Court, unless a motion for new trial or an appeal is filed, or an order staying the distribution is entered and not yet expired.

VIII. NOTICE

8.1 The SDR served this Application to all known parties in interest, including TLHIGA, and all individuals and entities identified by the SDR in the Certificate of Service by e-mail and, as noted, by mail or overnight delivery to certain government agencies. Further, this Application has been served in accordance with the provisions of TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303(e), which states:

Notice of each application for early access payments, or of any report required pursuant to this section, must be given in accordance with Section 443.007 to the guaranty associations that may have obligations arising from the liquidation. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 443.007, the liquidator shall provide these guaranty associations with at least 30 days' actual notice of the filing of the application and with a complete copy of the application prior to any action by the receivership court. Any guaranty association that may have obligations arising in connection with the liquidation has:

- (1) the right to request additional information from the liquidator, who may not unreasonably deny such request; and
- (2) the right to object as provided by Section 443.007 to any part of each application or to any report filed by the liquidator pursuant to this section.

8.2 TLIGA has waived the requirement of thirty (30) days' notice of the Application; it is set for submission before the Special Master on May 11, 2026.

IX. OFFER OF PROOF AND VERIFICATION

9.1 This Application is verified by the affidavit and certification pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE § 443.017(b) by Michael P. Marcin, partner in CANTILO & BENNETT, L.L.P., SDR of BHICOT.

X. NOTICE OF ELECTRONIC SERVICE REQUIREMENT

10.1 All pleadings filed in response to this Application or in regard to this estate shall be served by e-mail on the undersigned counsel and all parties shown in the attached Certificate of Service.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, CANTILO & BENNETT, L.L.P., in its capacity as Special Deputy Receiver of Bright Health Insurance Company of Texas, respectfully prays that this Court enter an Order:

1. Approving the Application in all respects;
2. Authorizing the SDR to distribute \$1,676,584.64 from the assets of the receivership estate to TLHIGA as the second early access distribution pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303;
3. Authorizing the SDR to make the second early access distribution following thirty (30) business days after the date the Order is entered by the Receivership Court, unless a motion for new trial or an appeal is filed, or an order staying the distribution is entered and not yet expired;
4. Ordering that TLHIGA shall, upon deposit of the payment in an account to TLIGHA's benefit, be deemed to have agreed to the provisions of TEX. INS. CODE § 443.303 and, in particular, § 443.303(g);

5. Authorizing the SDR to take any actions necessary to implement the Order;
6. Finding that the Order constitutes a final order resolving fully all issues relating to this Application, provided that this Court shall retain jurisdiction to issue further orders pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE Chapter 443; and
7. Granting the SDR such other and further relief to which it may be justly entitled.

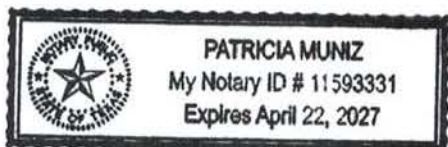
